







World Population, Female Education and Sustainable Development

a lecture by

Prof. Wolfgang Lutz

Better education, in particular of women, is vital to slow the world's population growth. Using the latest world population projections, Wolfgang Lutz will demonstrate that increasing women's education means there is a high chance the world population will peak around 2050-2070 and start to decline. His talk will also show how a smaller global population is central to reducing poverty, improving health, and increasing our ability to adapt to unavoidable climate change.

Prof. Lutz is the founding Director of the new "Wittgenstein Centre for Demography and Global Human Capital" which builds on his other roles as Leader of the World Population Program of IIASA, Director of the Vienna Institute of Demography of the Austrian Academy of Sciences and Professor of Applied Statistics at the Vienna University of Economics and Business.
